Project Overview

The Isaac Agree Downtown Synagogue, Detroit's only remaining synagogue, is nearing completion of a comprehensive renovation and reimagining of its historic downtown building.

Founded in 1921, the Downtown Synagogue celebrated its centennial with a \$5.75M capital campaign to transform the building into a hub for Jewish life in Detroit and meet the needs of the growing Jewish population in the city.

Construction is nearing completion, and the reimagined Downtown Synagogue will re-open in Fall 2023.

Shared Workspace

This model will allow partner organizations, primarily based in the suburbs, to expand their physical presence and impact on the city of Detroit.

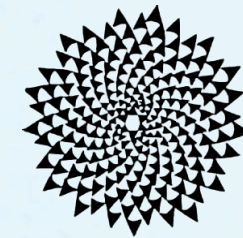

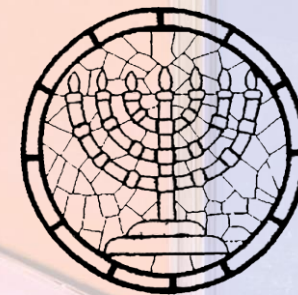

1921 →

ESTABLISHED

The Isaac Agree Memorial Society was established to support & enhance the role of traditional Judaism in Detroit.

1922 →

ROSEDALE COURT

IAMS met & held services in a house in Detroit's North End, sharing the space with the Torah Talmud.

1937 →

CAPITOL PARK

IAMS moved to the corner of Griswold & State streets in Capitol Park.

1940s →

ISAAC AGREE DOWNTOWN SYNAGOGUE

The Capitol Park building was officially named the Isaac Agree Downtown Synagogue.

1956 →

NOMADIC SHUL

After the synagogue was demolished, the congregation used various temporary locations for its services.

1960s →

FINALLY HOME

IADS moved into its current location, the former Fintex Men's Clothing store at Griswold & Clifford. However, Jewish residents & businesses were beginning to leave the city.

1990s →

DWINDLING

No longer able to sustain twice-daily worship services, IADS cut back to holding only Shabbat & holiday services.

2002 →

LAY LEADERSHIP

After Rabbi Gamze retired, IADS relied on a small group of dedicated congregants to lead services & coordinate events.

2016 →

RABBI ARIANA SILVERMAN

Thanks to the considerable efforts of lay leaders & generous philanthropic support, IADS was able to hire staff, including a rabbi.

2020 →

EXPONENTIAL GROWTH

As the IADS community & leadership team has grown, so have our relationships with Jewish organizations & participants across Metro Detroit.

2021 →

IADS CENTENNIAL

Hannukah 2021 was the Downtown Synagogue's 100th Anniversary.

2022 →

RENOVATION GROUNDBREAKING

Late Summer 2022, IADS & our community celebrated the renovation groundbreaking with a block party in Capitol Park.
